The district goals for the 2022-2023 school year are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Increase of 10% on track or mastered in all grades on TN Ready for math. ⇒ Increase the percentage of students who are on track or mastered to 30% on TCAP for ELA. <p style="text-align: center;">School Goals</p> <p>By analyzing student achievement data, areas of improvement have been targeted.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ For math, increase the percentage of on-track or mastered from 17% to 22% in 5th grade, from 23% to 28% in 6th grade, from 24% to 29% in 7th grade, and from 7% to 13% in 8th grade. ⇒ For ELA, increase the percentage of on-track or mastered from 19% to 24% in 5th grade, from 33% to 37% in 6th grade, from 36% to 44% in 7th grade, and from 3% to 15% in 8th grade. 	<p style="text-align: center;">In the Classroom</p> <p>Teachers are dedicated to helping our students achieve. Families can support their student’s education by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keeping open communication by using Class Dojo/teacher email. • Attending Title 1 nights to learn additional methods to support your child’s learning in reading and math. • Providing a quiet place for your child to complete homework assignments, study, and read. • Monitoring your child’s homework and ensuring that he or she has appropriate supplies. • Ensuring that your child attends school regularly, comes dressed in dress code, and arrives on time.
